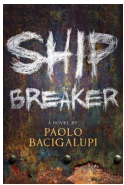

Ship Breaker– Paolo Bacigalupi

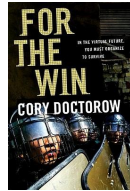

The Prince of Mist– Carlos Ruiz Zafron

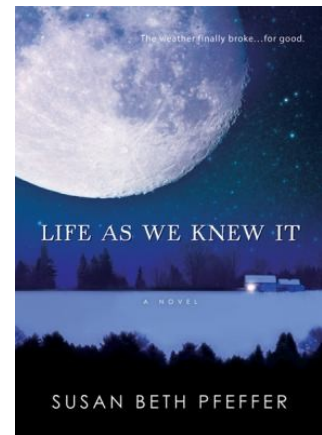
