## WANT TO LEARN A LANGUAGE- TRY

The Library is pleased to offer a new language learning database, Mango! Mango teaches conversational skills for 36 different languages: including Spanish, French, Japanese, Brazilian Portuguese, German, Mandarin Chinese, Greek, Italian, Russian, and more. Mango uses both verbal dialogs and written text so that you can see and hear the words.

To create an account, put in your email address and use your library card number as your password.

Basic Mango courses provide basic words and phrases for trips to the country. Mango Complete courses are aimed at students who want to move beyond basic language skills.

Mango also has a translation tool that allows you to translate from a foreign language into English and from English into a foreign language.

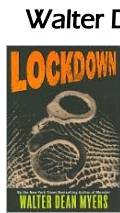

A group of teenagers uses their combined talents to re-steal several priceless paintings and save Kat Bishop's father, himself an international art thief, from a vengeful collector.

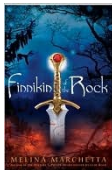


**Walter Dean Myers- *Lockdown***  
Reese, serving time at a juvenile detention facility, gets a lesson in making it through hard times from an unlikely friend with a harrowing past.



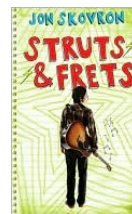
**Jordan Sonnenblick- *After Ever After***

**Melina Marchetta- *Finnikin of the Rock***



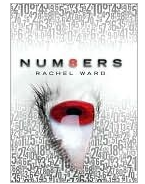
